Albertans encouraged to spend Family Day celebrating 'Golden Rules'

"Take the kids and explore our beautiful alpine scenery. Families are encouraged to start their weekend's early and visit local attractions, businesses and spend time participating in Golden's wide array of outdoor winter activities. Families can supplement their schedules with a number of preplanned activities happening in town throughout the weekend, including Golden's biggest winter event of the year and special activities at Kicking Horse Mountain Resort.

On February 13 at 6:45 p.m. more than one thousand people are expected to gather in Spirit Square for Golden's biggest winter festival. Celebrating its tenth anniversary, the Snow King's Masque Parade is a combination of creative self-expression via community art-making and theatrical spectacle. Guests will welcome Snow King and Lady Spring down from the mountain with a torch-lit escort. Families have the opportunity to get involved by creating 'low tech magic'. The parade will then move to the Golden Civic Centre where guests will enjoy an evening of music, dancing, stilt walking and giant puppets. "Our Masque Parade is a must-see for Albertans heading to the mountains for their Family Day weekend. Golden's most talented performers will be dressed in extravagant and intricately designed costumes. They put on a really entertaining show," says Sweeting. "We expect more than one thousand people to join us this year."

Starting on the evenings of February 12 and 13, families can enjoy an array of activities including disco tubing, a bouncy castle, skating, and night skiing at the Learning & Adventure Centre at Kicking Horse Mountain Resort. At the end of the night, guests can warm up by the fire pit and relax with a complimentary hot chocolate in hand.

To inspire families to venture outdoors, Helly Hansen will host a 'Gone on a catwalk' scavenger hunt on February 13. Between 9:00 a.m. and 4:00 p.m. skiers at Kicking Horse have the opportunity to claim Helly Hansen gear, including winter clothing and accessories, that have been hidden all over the resort in virtual form. Participants that are first to discover the virtual gear will have the items mailed to them. Helly Hansen's 'Winter Duel' app must be downloaded to participate. This weekend's Concert Series will showcase The Swillbillies, Joel Falardeau and Tony Bell on Feb 12, 13 and 14 respectively. Families can sample the new après-ski menu, including nachos, ribs and sharing platters, in addition to happy hour drink specials.
