

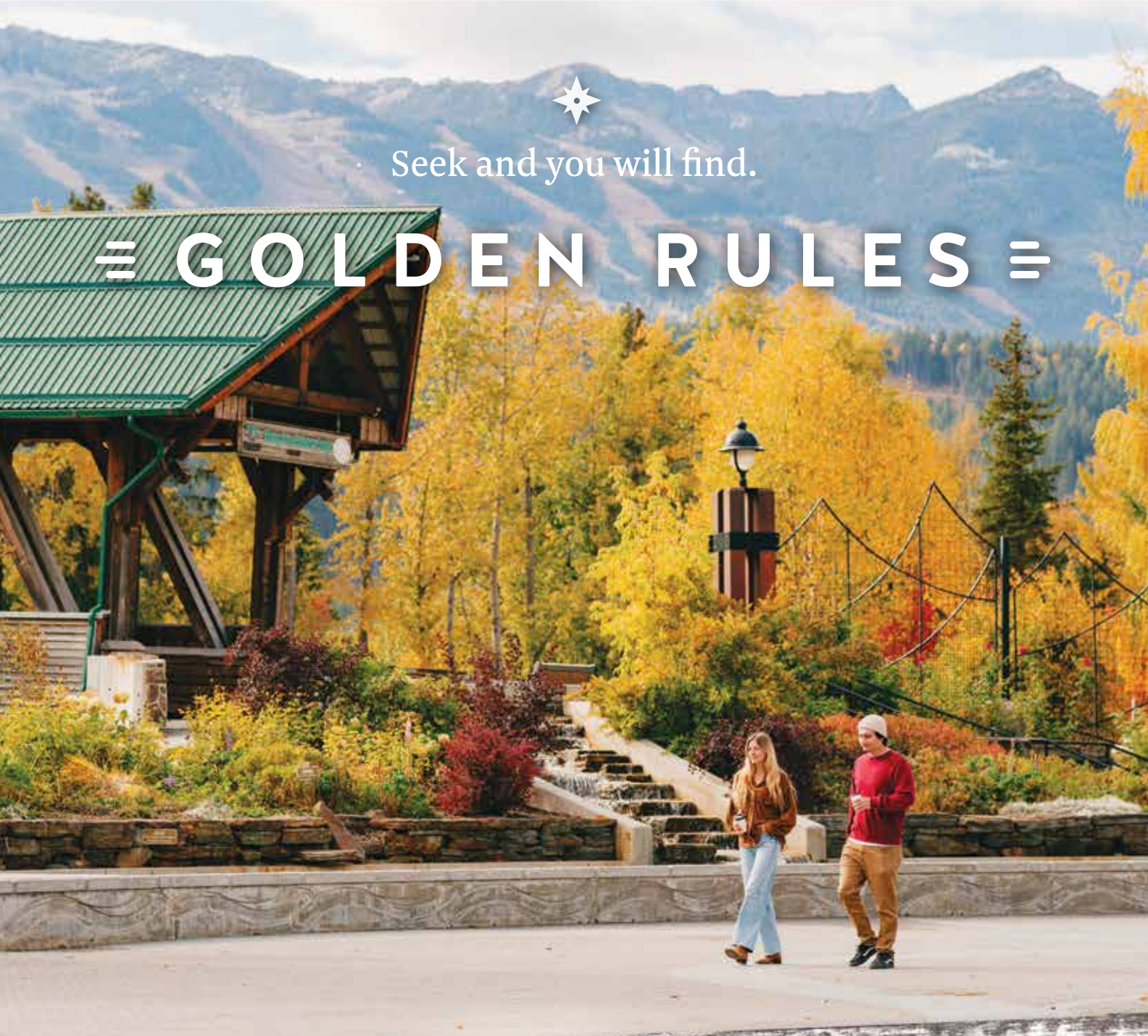

We want all users to enjoy the outdoors safely and sustainably. We ask that you follow some simple guidelines:

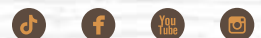
- Plan ahead and prepare.

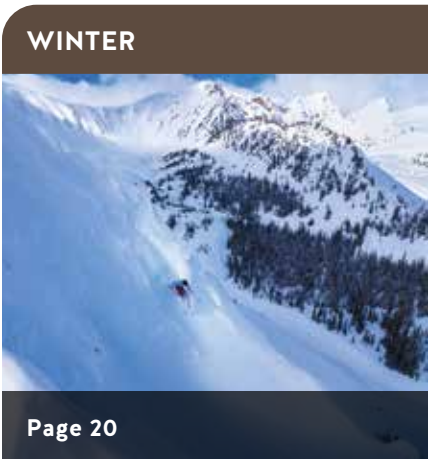

Once you are in Golden there are multiple ways to find information about Golden activities, experiences, attractions, places to stay and dine.

Drop into the Golden Visitor Centre where you will find friendly, welcoming visitor information counsellors who can help you create your own customised itinerary. Pick up free travel planners, brochures, maps, and other useful information, or purchase Parks Canada passes, attraction tickets and Golden souvenirs. Come visit the Indigenous Cultural and Art Interpretive Display.

Other facilities at the centre include:

- Digital kiosks
- Picnic tables
- Dog run
- Potable water
- Sani-dump (user fee applies)
- Gender-neutral, accessible washrooms

The Golden Visitor Centre is open during the summer months, and is located at 1000 Trans Canada Highway. Visit www.tourismgolden.com/visitors for more information.

Free WiFi is provided at the Visitor Centre. Use the WiFi hotspot to add the Golden BC App to your device.

Our Hiking, Biking and Outdoor Discovery maps will help you get the most of your time on the trails. View them online, or pick them up at the Golden Visitor Centre, or other locations around town. Braille versions are available for review at the Visitor Centre.

You can speak to a Golden Information Counsellor at the Golden Farmer's Market during the summer months. If you're travelling without your own device, digital kiosks providing access to tourismgolden.com are situated in the Golden Visitor Centre.

Plan ahead

You will love that Golden is a small, welcoming community off the beaten track, but that also means there are fewer resources than a city. We suggest the following to help you and our residents to enjoy your visit more:

- Book your accommodation before you arrive.
- Book your activities ahead of time.
- Make reservations and eat at off-peak hours.

Learn the culture

Learning about the community that you visit not only enhances your experience but is also a sign of respect for the locals who reside here.

Head to the Golden Museum to learn about Golden through the ages. To learn more about the Indigenous Nations who have a connection to this land, view our Indigenous People's page online or visit the Golden Visitor Centre.

Respect the land

- Leave what you find, and take what you bring.
- Do not feed or approach wild animals. Don't stop your vehicle for photos of wildlife.
- Follow Fire Smart practices. Check fire bans, abide by restrictions, and use designated fire pits to prevent wildfires.
- Clean, Drain, and Dry. All users must completely wash and dry off before entering a body of water.
- Clean your gear before entering and leaving trails and recreation sites.



- Fishing requires a permit.
- Off-road vehicles are prohibited in national & provincial parks.
- Do not damage plants or alter the environment.
- Stay on trail and respect closers and designated boundaries.

Remember, you are responsible for your own safety.

- Get advice from a Visitor Centre.
- Study trail descriptions and maps before starting.
- Check the weather forecast and current trail conditions.
- Check avalanche conditions, active logging and restrictions that may be applied to forest service roads.
- Pack adequate food, water, clothing, maps, and gear.
- Carry a first aid kit and bear spray.
- Tell somebody where you're going, when you'll be back, and who to call if you don't return.
- Travel with a friend or group.
- Be prepared for emergencies and changes in weather.

The Golden Triangle is a spectacular 316 km triangular route that will take you on an epic journey through the Canadian Rockies, national parks and natural landscapes along the Trans-Canada Highway 1, Highway 93 and Highway 95.

Use Golden as your base from which to explore the Golden Triangle, or make the journey part of your vacation by taking the opportunity to explore the Golden Triangle as an alternative route for getting to Golden. Either way, make sure you experience the majestic mountain scenery, abundant nature, and outdoor activities and experiences in Yoho and Kootenay National Parks, the Village of Radium, Radium Hot Springs and the Columbia River and Wetlands.

Discover the towering rock walls, waterfalls and high peaks in Yoho National Park. Experience the unique contrasts of Kootenay National Park, from icy mountain rivers to steamy hot springs. Both of these national parks offer fantastic roadside and hiking opportunities.

Travel along Highway 95, and you will have the magnificent Columbia River and Wetlands to admire. The Columbia Wetlands are the largest protected wetlands in North America, and provide habitat to hundreds of thousands of birds, fish, reptiles, amphibians and mammals.

Use the interactive Golden Triangle map to plan your route and to discover the many things to do throughout the circuit.

7 day Snow Lovers' Dream

Tourism Golden is grateful to live, work and play on the traditional unceded territory of the Ktunaxa and Secwépemc peoples which is also home to the Métis Nation Columbia River Society.

The Ktunaxa People - ᑕᑕᑎᑦᑕᑦᑕ - Golden Area



Before the Ktunaxa, it was the Spirit Animals that occupied the country. The Ktunaxa creation story speaks of the giant, Naᑎᑎᑎᑎᑎ, and a prophecy from the Creator that would ultimately create all the Human Beings in the world.

The Ktunaxa language is unique to their homelands, not related to any other in the world. Their culture is embedded in the Ktunaxa language and teaches them who they are and where they come from through their stories and songs. In Ktunaxa, the word for the town of Golden is ᑕᑕᑎᑦᑕᑦᑕ - a word that describes the color of the water as it runs down into the Columbia. It says it is muddy or silty making it look white.

When the Ktunaxa lived and moved freely throughout their homelands, many Ktunaxa families lived along the upper Columbia River (Miᑎᑎᑎᑎᑎ) from its headwaters through and including ᑕᑕᑎᑦᑕᑦᑕ working the land and harvesting wild vegetation. Hunting trails extend throughout the area and tie in with several portage trails all the way north to Boat Encampment and connect with the trail over Athabasca Pass to Jasper House.

The Ktunaxa utilized many resources here in ᑕᑕᑎᑦᑕᑦᑕ and it was important as a “mustering point” connecting travelers from all directions, much as it still does today.

Secwépemc Shuswap Nations



We are the Secwépemc - the spread-out people. We have been caretakers of Secwépemculecw since time immemorial. Our laws and customs were given to us by Skélep (Coyote) as laid out in our ancient oral histories. Secwépemc laws govern the Secwépemc Nation and form the moral and spiritual

foundation of Secwépemc society. This foundation is inherently connected to the land and our history.

Since the “birth” of the nation known as Canada we’ve had to navigate a world of colonization and the enforcement of the Indian Act. The scope of our governance has been reduced to reserves and elected Chiefs and Councils. We are fortunate to have not lost the thread of our laws, our oral histories, or knowledge of our lands, and we continue to work to strengthen these through Rights & Title assertions across the territory.

Shuswap Band (Kenpesq̓t) is one of 17 Federal Government Bands of the Secwépemc/Shuswap Nation, established in the 1860s. Though 17 bands are recognized today, the Secwépemc Nation had over 32 ‘campfires’ throughout the territory pre-contact.

Métis Nation

Metis Nation Columbia River Society is one of 39 chartered communities of Metis Nation British Columbia serving the Indigenous peoples of Golden and area. Their mission is to promote culture, provide education and tend to the well being of their people.



They network with all service providers in their community to better enable them to provide outreach to those in isolation or in need. Their Elders are available to the schools to teach history, language, dance and culture. They offer workshops in basketmaking, beading, capote making, food preservation, making balms and lotions, archery, foraging and many other traditional ways of being and knowing.

Special celebrations are Louis Riel Day/ Metis Week, National Indigenous Peoples Day, National Day of Truth and Reconciliation and they support their extended community by participation in their Pride Event, Trade fairs, parades, Snow King Festival and other events. They are very active in all aspects of teaching and living their culture and are proud to say that their community has come to respect, support and partner with them on many projects.

THE GOLDEN JOURNEY



A story of exploration, railways, rivers and forests.

In 1807, David Thompson – renowned fur trader, surveyor and map-maker tasked by the North West Company to open up a trading route to the lucrative trading territories of the Pacific Northwest – first crossed over the Rocky Mountains and traveled along the Blaeberry River to the future site of Golden. In search of the Columbia River and, ultimately, a passage to the Pacific Ocean, Thompson’s travels took him through the pass to the junction of the legendary Columbia and Kicking Horse Rivers. At this time, the pass was known to the Indigenous Peoples long before the arrival of Europeans and was part of traditional trading and hunting routes.

Canadian Pacific Railway between Lake Louise and Field. The pass and river were named Kicking Horse when Sir James Hector, a naturalist, geologist and surgeon was kicked by his horse and was initially believed dead by the expedition members.

In 1881 the CPR hired surveyor A.B. Rogers to find a rail route through the Selkirk and Rocky Mountains, and in 1882 he found the pass now named for him. Rogers established a base camp for his survey crew led by a man named McMillan. Initially known as ‘McMillan’s Camp’, the settlement was the beginning of the town of Golden. By 1884 in response to a nearby lumber camp naming itself ‘Silver City’ the residents of McMillan’s Camp, decided not to be outdone and renamed the settlement ‘Golden City’.

CPR completed the railway in 1885, which also paved the way for the Trans-Canada Highway, and Golden soon became a prominent stop on the line. The building of the CPR line, which required huge quantities of timber for railway ties, bridges, trestles, snowsheds, and buildings, was the catalyst for the growth of the forestry industry in Golden. For over a century, the CPR and the forestry industry have provided employment and well-being to the town.

The Sikh community history runs deep in Golden and early settlers employed by the Columbia River Logging Company date back to the 1890s. They were housed in company-built residences and carried out their religious ceremonies in a Gurdwara (temple) built on mill property. Located on what is now 13th Street South, The Gurdwara is reputed to be the first Sikh temple in North America. Although the original Gurdwara and the company houses are gone, the Sikh community made and continues to make significant contributions to the settlement and development of the town of Golden.



The Palliser Expedition explored and surveyed Western Canada between 1857 and 1860. Led by John Palliser, the expedition discovered a high mountain pass across the Continental Divide which later became the route of the main line constructed by

The Canadian Pacific Railway recognized that many travellers through Golden would want to stay, explore and discover the incredible area for themselves. To this end, the CPR hired professional Swiss guides to assist in providing a safe connection to this compelling yet rugged landscape. In 1899, Eduard Feuz Sr. and Christian Haesler came to Canada from Switzerland to serve as mountain guides. Between 1899 and 1954, there were a total of 35 Swiss guides who provided expertise for thousands of climbs and the safe ascents of many peaks surrounding Golden – without a single fatality.

The wives of the Swiss Guides kept home hearths warm, and helped build the community that still stands today. Often, their husbands would be gone for months at a time and the women tended to the children and households, as well as administrative work. It was said that their handicrafts and knits became famous and respected in the community.

Recognising that working in Canada whilst their families remained in Switzerland was not at all ideal, the CPR management constructed permanent homes for the Swiss Guides and their families. In 1912, the Edelweiss Village was complete with six chalets which became the homes of the second generation of guides and their families. The homes still exist today and are open for donations to preserve and promote the Edelweiss Village for present and future generations.

Golden’s Swiss Guides; yesterday and today.

Syd Feuz was the first Canadian-Swiss Guide. The son of Walter Feuz, he was born in 1922, raised in the Edelweiss Village and lived many years in Golden. Working not only as a mountain and heli-ski guide, Syd had many other jobs and also ran other businesses with his wife Baeda, making them an integral part of the Golden community. Feuz Bowl at Kicking Horse Mountain Resort is named for Syd and his family and in 2010 he was honoured by the community to carry the Olympic Torch into Golden as it passed on its journey across Canada.

Rudi Gertsch is a second generation Swiss Mountain Guide, talented skier and climber. Arriving in Western Canada in his early twenties, he began working as a climbing guide then as a heli-ski guide and occasional movie stunt double. In 1974 he started Purcell Heli-skiing which today is owned and operated by Canadian Mountain Holidays. A founding member of Heli-Cat Canada, Rudi still plays an integral role in the heli-skiing and mountain guiding industry in Western Canada.

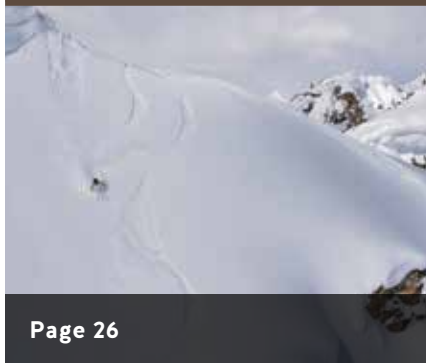

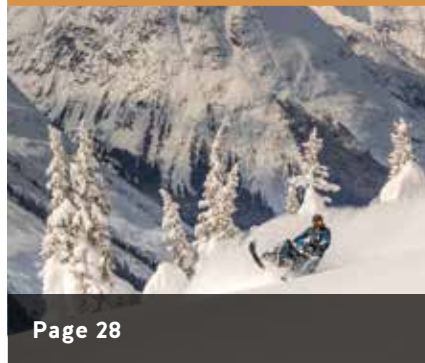

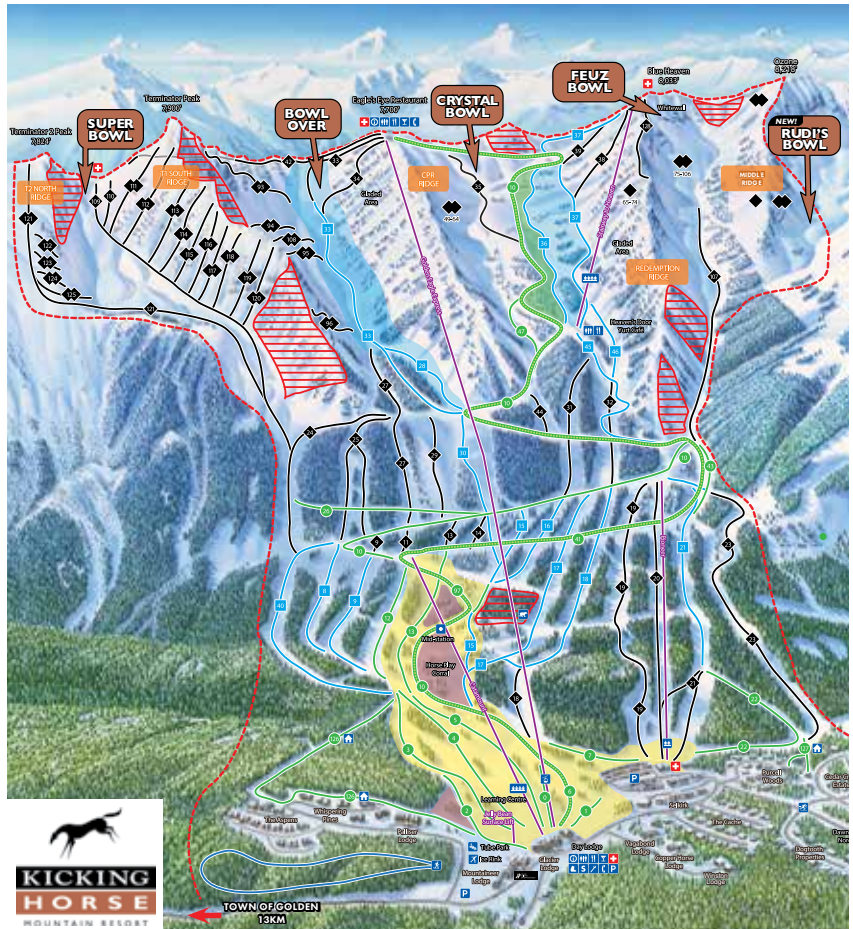

The Dogtooth Range of the Purcell Mountains is easily accessible from Kicking Horse Mountain Resort and offers beautiful alpine bowls. 78km/49mi from Golden lies Rogers Pass. It can be an epic backcountry experience, but you need to have the experience. With an average of 14 meters of snowfall a year at treeline, Rogers Pass in Glacier National Park is a popular backcountry ski touring destination with extremely complex terrain.

To backcountry ski in Rogers Pass, you must obtain a mandatory winter permit. Learn it, get your permit www.pc.gc.ca/skirogerspass

Make sure you have the proper equipment, training, and knowledge before heading out in the backcountry.

Quartz Creek

Quartz Creek is Golden's most popular area with a cabin located at the end of the groomed trails and great access to many alpine bowls. Two areas, Old Man and East Quartz, as well as the West Bench Trail are accessible from the Quartz Creek staging area. The West Bench Trail is an excellent family ride that provides a connection to Gorman Lake and is not exposed to avalanche hazard. Quartz Creek has excellent parking and is located right off the Trans Canada Highway, 40km west of Golden.

Gorman Lake

Gorman Lake is Golden's most advanced sledding zone and gets better as the winter's snow accumulates. With a large parking lot and close proximity to town it's becoming more popular each year and is a local favourite.

Silent Pass

Silent Pass, located south of Golden, is one of Golden's most beautiful riding areas. The groomed trails vary in length depending on the forestry industry. The trail towards Silent Pass also accesses many lakes popular for ice fishing. Beginner and intermediate riders need to be prepared for a difficult single-track climb to the alpine, especially in the early season, but once in the alpine, the area is excellent for all abilities.

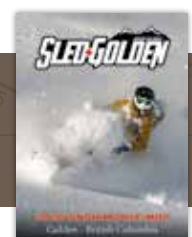
If you're a first time rider, or inexperienced in mountain riding, check out one of Golden's tour operators or guiding outfits.

Visit the Northern Lights Wolf Centre or Buffalo Ranch in the beautiful Blaeberry Valley. Pack a picnic and spend the day by the Blaeberry River.



Head to Keith King Memorial Sports Fields or Kicking Horse Mountain Resort for a fun game of disc golf. Discs can be purchased at downtown stores and at Kicking Horse Mountain Resort.

Logistics

To make the most of your visit, we recommend planning ahead and visiting during off-peak times. July and August are the busiest months, so consider booking your trip in the spring or fall to avoid large crowds. If you’re visiting during peak season, arriving early in the morning can help in avoiding the crowds.

Parking at Emerald Lake and Takakkaw Falls can be busy and visiting during off-peak times is advised. Parking in Lake Louise is limited during the summer season, and Moraine Lake Road is closed year-round to personal vehicles. The best way to experience Lake Louise and Moraine Lake in the summer months is by Parks Canada shuttle. Advanced reservations are required. Free parking is available at the Lake Louise Park and Ride for visitors with a Parks Canada shuttle reservation. Lake O’Hara also requires advanced reservation.

Glacier National Park

Known for its mountaineering history, deep snow, and pristine wilderness, Glacier National Park and Rogers Pass National Historic Site offer incredible experiences for every type of explorer. Rogers Pass is a 1 hour drive west of Golden and is much quieter than Yoho, Banff, or Jasper.

Discover Canada's mountain history and spectacular natural beauty through day-use areas, hiking trails, and the Rogers Pass Discovery Centre. Explore self-guided interpretive trails, abandoned railway tracks, stone trestles, and snow sheds. Several trails climb steeply into the alpine, bringing you close to glaciers. Abbott Ridge (pictured) and Perley Rock Trail are classic choices for hikers looking for a longer day. Bear Creek Falls is a short hike to a beautiful waterfall, while Hemlock Grove Boardwalk offers an accessible forest experience.

Yoho National Park

Known as a hiker's paradise, Yoho National Park and Kicking Horse Pass National Historic Site feature spectacular scenery, geology, paleontology, and railway history. Yoho is a 25 min drive east from Golden.

Yoho is home to glacial lakes, stunning waterfalls, snow topped peaks and towering rock walls. One of Canada's tallest, and most magnificent waterfalls, Takakkaw Falls, is a must see. Powdered rock, from Yoho's numerous glaciers, creates the deep turquoise colour of Emerald Lake and Lake O'Hara. The Iceline, Paget Lookout and Emerald Lake trails provide incredible hiking opportunities to spectacular viewpoints and natural landmarks. The Burgess Shale fossil bed is famous for its soft-bodied fossils dating back over 500 million years. There are three guided Burgess Shale hikes in Yoho National Park.

Kootenay National Park

Established in 1920 as part of an agreement to build a new road across the central Canadian Rockies – the Banff-Windermere Highway. Kootenay National Park is a place of unique contrasts, from icy mountain rivers to steamy hot springs and is the only national park to feature both glacier-clad peaks along the Continental Divide and semi-arid grasslands in the Columbia Valley.

Visitors can enjoy guided hikes to the Burgess Shale fossil beds in Kootenay National Park. The world famous Burgess Shale is part of the larger Canadian Rocky Mountain Parks UNESCO World Heritage Site. Easy hikes with fantastic rewards include Olive Lake, Numa Falls, the Paint Pots, Marble Canyon and the Fireweed trail, all right beside the road.

For adventurous hikers, there are trails to sublime destinations above the timberline. The majestic Rockwall trail is an epic hike that traverses three alpine passes, past impressive hanging glaciers. The trail's defining feature is a single, massive limestone cliff, towering in some locations more than 900m (2953 feet) above the trail below. Check the trail report for current conditions.

More than any of the other mountain national parks, Kootenay has a unique look created by fire. Natural wildfires in the 20th century have shaped the park's biology and offer visitors annual snapshots of forests and landscapes in glorious transition.

Golden is an angler's dream, with spectacular mountain scenery, glacier-fed lakes, rivers, and streams with great fishing options.

The fishing opportunities in and around Golden are endless, ranging from early and late rainbow trout, small cut throat trout in alpine lakes to char in the river and giant ling [burbot] and bull trout in the hydro reservoir.

Golden is situated on the Columbia River, which includes a vast selection of rivers and streams as its tributaries. These and the numerous lakes that surround Golden offer fabulous fishing options for spin casting and fly fishing from the shore or boat.

Hire an experienced local fishing guide; they know the best locations and lures to help you get your next big catch.

Make sure to review responsible BC freshwater fishing regulations and purchase your mandatory B.C. Recreational Freshwater Fishing Licence from the Wildlife Information and Licensing Data (WILD) system.

Blaeberry River

This glacial-fed river was first used by explorer David Thompson but today offers gentle rafting, fishing and picnic opportunities.

Columbia River

The Columbia River is designated a B.C. Heritage river. Ideal for canoeing, stand up paddle boarding and viewing wildlife.

Reflection Lake

A protected wildlife sanctuary, this is an excellent spot for viewing waterfowl and picnicking.

Kicking Horse River

The first river in B.C. to be recognised as a national heritage river. Famous for its unparalleled whitewater rafting and kayaking.

Kinbasket Lake

260km long reservoir created by the construction of the Mica Dam. With several boat launches, it is popular with locals for fishing.

Mitten Lake

Featuring a large dock, boat launch area and campsite with a small beach, you'll find locals here canoeing, fishing and picnicking.

Responsible Travel for Water Recreation

CLEAN DRAIN AND DRY

Your watercraft, gear and water toys

1. Clean off all plant parts, animals, and mud from boat and equipment (eg. boots, waders, fishing gear). Use warm water and use a power wash station if available.
2. Drain onto land all items that can hold water (eg. buckets, wells bilge, and ballast).
3. Dry all items completely before launching into another body of water.

Stopping at watercraft inspections is mandatory. Golden's inspection station is at 1000 TransCanada Hwy. To prevent the spread of invasive species, all users from swimmers to animals should wash off and be completely dry before using another body of water.

- Only motorized vessels with 20hp (15kw) or less allowed in the Columbia River main channel.
- No towing or wakeboarding permitted in the reaches of the river.

Thanks to the continuous efforts of the Golden Cycling Club, Golden boasts over 50 trails and more than 125km of cross country riding on the Moonraker, CBT and Mountain Shadows trail systems.

If you need to hone your skills before getting onto the trails, visit the pump track and skatepark in downtown Golden or the skills park at Keith King Sports Fields.

Golden Rotary Trails

Explore 16km of trails that run alongside rivers and connect to the downtown core. These trails are perfect for laid back family rides.

Golden Triangle

Mount 7

Golden is blessed with Mount 7, one of the finest and most challenging downhill systems in Canada. Enjoy 35km of riding and 15 trails from smooth flowy descents to expert chutes and steeps. Modern downhill was born on Mount 7 with the legendary "Race Line" hosting the famed Psychosis DH. Mount 7 is the real deal for hard core downhill enthusiasts, with a summit elevation of 1942 metres (6,372 ft), accessed via a 14km unpaved forestry service road.

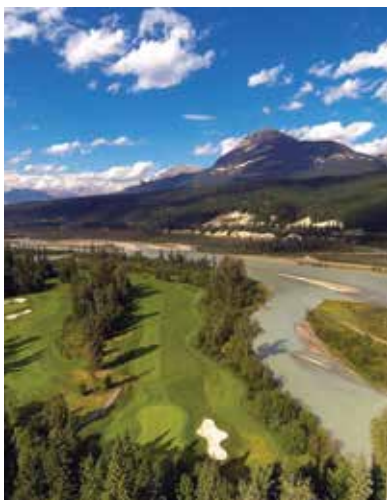

MOUNTAINEERING & CLIMBING

Seek and you will find.

Since 1885 when Canadian botanist J. Macoun and his son made the first recorded climbs in Rogers Pass, the mountains around Golden have been climbed by many adventurers.

In 1888, British mountaineers Rev. W. Spotswood Green and Rev. H. Swanzy completed the first recreational technical climbs in the Selkirk Mountains and established Glacier National Park as the birthplace of mountaineering in North America. They were followed by Swiss mountain guides Edward Feuz Sr. and Christian Hasler who made many first ascents as they guided tourists into the mountains.

Today the parks and mountains around Golden, including Yoho and Glacier National Parks and Bugaboo Spires are renowned as some of the best areas for North American alpinism.

Three of the “Classic 50 Climbs in North America” are all within easy reach from Golden. Northwest Ridge of Mt. Sir Donald is located near Rogers Pass in Glacier National Park. The Beckey-Chouinard Route on South Howser Tower and the East Ridge of the Bugaboo Spire are both located in Bugaboo Provincial Park.

Golden has various sport climbing areas all within easy driving distance. South of Golden, Spillimacheen offers over 60 sport climbing routes ranging from 5.6 to 5.12 from spring to late fall.

Rock climbing should only be attempted by experienced mountaineers and climbers. An ACMG guide is recommended.

Despite Golden’s small size, the town has a welcoming, tight-knit climbing community. Visit tourismgolden.com/climbing for more information for drop-in climbing and public programs.

Let nature take its course.

Golden offers opportunities to experience wildlife in ways that are inspiring and informative. From mountaintops to forested valleys, this is a place where visitors can connect with some of the region's iconic animals.

At Kicking Horse Mountain Resort, the Grizzly Bear Interpretive Centre introduces visitors to resident grizzly Boo. In this protected habitat, you can observe bear behaviour while learning about grizzly ecology, conservation, and habitat.

For a closer look at one of Canada's most misunderstood predators, visit the Northern Lights Wolf Centre. Interpretive experiences help visitors understand wolf behaviour, pack dynamics, and the role wolves play in a healthy ecosystem.

Wildlife experiences around Golden extend beyond interpretation centres. In nearby Glacier National Park, guided grizzly bear hikes on Balu Pass offer opportunities to learn about bear habitat, tracks, movement, and behaviour in the field.

For another encounter, head to the Rocky Mountain Buffalo Ranch to see plains bison and gain insight into these animals and their place in western Canadian history.

Whether you are drawn to bears, wolves, or bison, Golden offers opportunities to connect with wildlife while deepening your appreciation for the landscapes they inhabit.

Golden is also a remarkable place to experience wildlife in many forms. Along valley bottoms, wetlands, forests, and alpine slopes, visitors may spot wild animals throughout the changing seasons.

Look for elk and deer grazing in open areas, bighorn sheep on rocky terrain, and mountain goats in higher elevations. Moose, black bears, and grizzly bears also inhabit the Golden area.

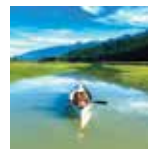
Birdlife is especially abundant, with bald eagles, ospreys, great blue herons, waterfowl, and songbirds all part of the region's rich biodiversity. Golden offers rewarding wildlife viewing in every direction here for visitors.

Golden is part of the BC Bird Trail, and the Columbia Wetlands is one the largest intact wetlands in North America and a designated Ramsar Wetlands of International Importance. This landscape supports hundreds of bird species and each spring and fall, 15,000 migratory birds depend on these wetlands to rest and feed.

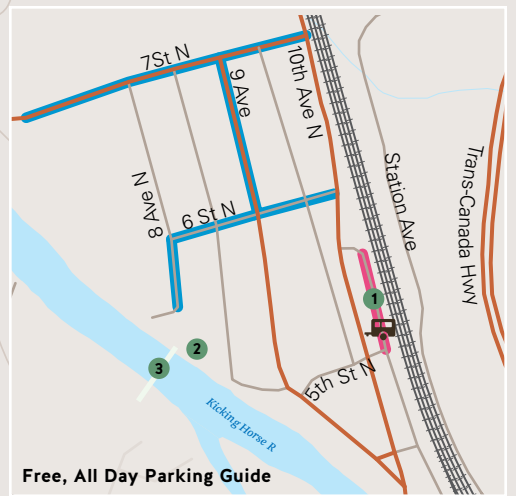

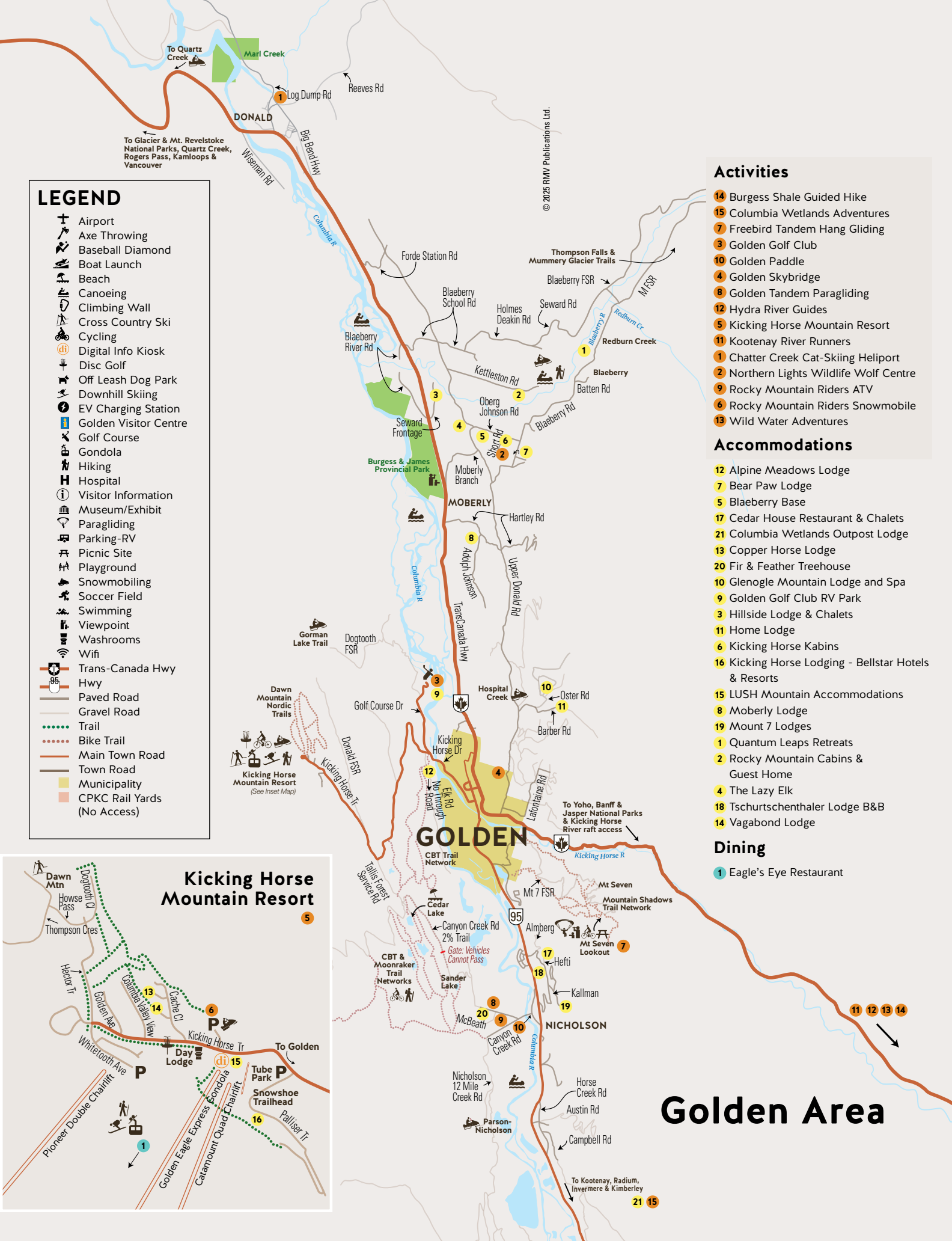

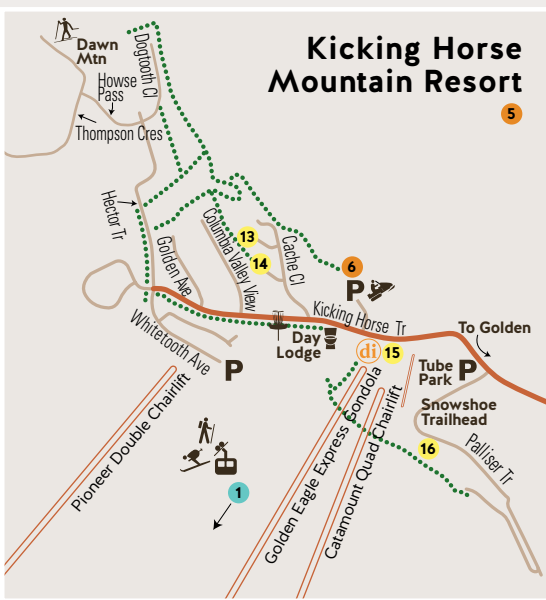
